
Recent Wins

Field Training Exercise

On October 20-23 over 20 Cadets participated in this year's first Field Training Exercise (FTX), endured frost and spent some fun time together at the beautiful Pinaus Lake near Falkland. For many Cadets this was the first FTX experience and they all loved it. Cadets practiced key survival skills such as: shelter building, knife safety, how to collect water and build a fire and signal fires. FTX is a mandatory training for Air Cadets. At least once a year, Cadets of different levels would be offered a chance to go on a field training exercise. Other than having fun doing activities, these FTXs would allow cadets to learn and practice basic skills when stranded in the wilderness. Such skills include, first aid, building shelters based on situation, strategies to get rescued, and much more.



Gliding in Oliver

On October 16, 24 Cadets went to Oliver to participate in one of the biggest Squadron events – gliding and flying. Cadets were given the chance to ride in a tow plane and a glider as well as participating in the operations that follow.

They learned about the protocols and operations of the airport as well as how the glider

works. Each cadet got to go up in a tow plane as well as a glider to experience soaring through the sky. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity for teenagers.
